



West Muskingum Local Schools Continuity of Services Plan 2021-2022

 - a. Universal and correct wearing of masks:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will follow the Ohio Department of Health and the Zanesville-Muskingum County Health Department requirements.
 - b. Physical distancing (e.g., including use of cohorts/podding):
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will follow the Ohio Department of Health and the Zanesville-Muskingum County Health Department requirements.
 - c. Handwashing and respiratory etiquette:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will continue current handwashing and respiratory etiquette guidelines.
 - d. Cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools has adjusted its custodial and maintenance duties to give more attention to cleaning and sanitizing high touch areas throughout the building. The district will continue to utilize electrostatic sprayers to assist in sanitation where appropriate.
 - e. Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the state, local, territorial or tribal health departments:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will follow the Ohio Department of Health and the Zanesville-Muskingum County Health Department requirements.
 - f. Diagnostic and screening testing:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will follow the Ohio Department of Health and the Zanesville-Muskingum County Health Department requirements.
 - g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to educators, other staff and students, if eligible:
 - i. In cooperation with Genesis Healthcare, West Muskingum Local Schools hosted a vaccine clinic in February and March of 2021 for staff members, The district will defer to district parents to determine whether or not their child receives a COVID-19 vaccination.

- h. Appropriate accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies:
 - i. West Muskingum Local Schools will follow our board of education policies regarding students with disabilities
- 2. Each LEA plan describes how it will ensure continuity of services including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health and other needs, which may include student health and food services:**
 - a. Principals, teachers, and counselors will monitor student's grades to identify at-risk students. Principals will also monitor testing results (NWEA MAP) to assess both building and individual student needs.
 - b. Principals and counselors will monitor the social and emotional well being of individual students and the student body as a whole.
 - c. Principals will collaborate with district administrators on the staff's social, emotional, mental health and other needs
 - d. West Muskingum Local Schools will continue to offer weekly food pick-up during the summer months for families of the district at no cost to the families.
